We encourage children to make links with other books whenever they read. This helps them to draw on their previous learning, make meaning of what they are reading and recognise themes within stories and texts.

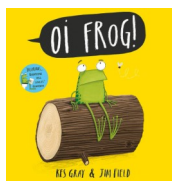
When reading with your child, it is helpful to ask them things such as:
